EDUCATION CORNER

A BRIEF HISTORY OF FREEMASONRY

The Craft then took a step destined to revolutionize it and to set it on a new path of power and magnitude. On St. John the Baptist's Day, June 24, 1717, four or more old Lodges of London and Westminster met in London and organized a Grand Lodge, and on the same day selected their first Grand Master, W. M. Anthony Sayer. Within a few years of that date the Craft had completed the transformation from an Operative Body into a Speculative Fraternity (by "Speculative" is meant Masonry in a moral or symbolical sense), reorganized the two old degrees into the three degrees of Entered Apprentice, Fellowcraft, and Master Mason; collected and collated the old Masonic manuscripts; produced the first book of Constitutions, and was chartering Lodges in many countries, including our own, to take care of the Fraternity's membership. which began to increase rapidly shortly after the organization of the Mother Grand Lodge.
