EDUCATION CORNER

A BRIEF HISTORY OF FREEMASONRY

This was the beginning of organized Speculative Freemasonry as we know it. In 1751 a second Grand Lodge was organized in England; prior to that, Grand Lodges had been set up in Scotland, Ireland, and on the continent. American Lodges were under the charge of Provincial Grand Lodges, which were ruled by Provincial Grand Masters appointed by the Grand Lodge in England, or in Scotland, or in Ireland. As a result of the American Revolution, one after another American Grand Lodge became sovereign and independent. The question arose at that time whether there should be one Grand Lodge for the whole of the United States, but the wisdom of the Craft prevailed and the scheme was abandoned.
