EDUCATION CORNER

A BRIEF HISTORY OF FREEMASONRY

Between 1861 and 1865, eight Lodges had been chartered in Nevada by the Grand Lodge of California. In January 1865, delegates- from these Lodges met in convention at Virginia City.

At this convention, seven Lodges were represented: Carson Lodge, Washoe Lodge, Virginia Lodge, Silver City (now Amity) Lodge, Silver Star Lodge, Esmeralda Lodge and Escurial Lodge. Lander Lodge was not represented, probably on account of distance, but readily endorsed the work of the convention. All these Lodges were holding California registry charters. The convention, on the first day, adopted a constitution, elected and installed a full corps of Grand Lodge Officers and then adjourned sine die, or indefinitely.
